## Are you a community worker who works with older people in the Eastern Metropolitan Region?

ROSE is a free and confidential multidisciplinary legal program that supports people experiencing or at risk of **elder abuse**.



## What is elder abuse?

Elder abuse is any act which causes harm to an older person and is carried out by someone they know and trust. Often that person is a family member or carer, but it could be a friend or neighbour who they depend on.

The abuse can be financial, psychological, emotional, physical or sexual. It can also involve deliberate social isolation or neglect.

### Examples include:

- misusing a power of attorney or guardianship;
- pressuring someone to sell their property;
- pressuring them to change their will or power of attorney;
- threatening to hurt anyone, including their pet;
- neglect of caring responsibilities;
- accessing their bank account without permission.

## A multi-disciplinary response

ROSE is a multi-disciplinary team that provides intensive legal, financial counselling and social support to people at risk of or experiencing elder abuse

## How can ROSE help your client?

The **Community Lawyer** can provide legal advice about a person's rights and options, and conducts legal casework and advocacy.

Legal issues ROSE can assist with include:

- family violence;
- family care arrangements;
- issues with powers of attorney, and guardianship and administration orders;
- theft and misuse of assets;
- fines; and
- property transfers without consent.

The **Advocate** can provide information and support with:

- ongoing risk assessments and helping to develop a comprehensive safety plan;
- referrals to specialist services;
- ongoing case management support;
- advocacy; and
- emotional and practical support and linkages.

The **Financial Counsellor** can assist your client with:

- a holistic assessment of their financial situation;
- information about their consumer legal rights and obligations;
- options to address their debt issues;
- advocacy and negotiation. For example, banks, payday lenders, telecommunication providers, utility providers, and dispute resolution bodies.

## Referrals

If you believe your client has experienced or is at risk of elder abuse, you can speak to them about making a confidential referral to the ROSE team. Your client's consent is required to make a referral. A referral can then be made by completing the form on our website ([www.eclc.org.au/rose](http://www.eclc.org.au/rose)) and emailing it to: [rose@eclc.org.au](mailto:rose@eclc.org.au). Alternatively, please contact the ROSE Program on **0429 697 960**.

**ROSE will assist only if your client wants it to – nothing happens without their consent. They are in control at all times.**

## Who is eligible for assistance:

Someone who is experiencing or is at risk of experiencing elder abuse and:

1. Is 50 years and over and identifies as a member of the Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Community; or
2. Is 65 years and over and not a member of the Aboriginal or Torres Strait Islander Community; and
3. Is seeking assistance for a legal issue; and
4. Needs or is likely to need support or assistance from an elder abuse advocate and/or financial counsellor; and
5. The client lives in Melbourne's eastern region.
